# What's important to you when choosing a kitchen or bath countertop?

- Is it the surface color, pattern, or movement in the material?
- Are visible seams ok, or do you prefer a seamless appearance?
- Is stain resistance or low maintenance one of your priorities?
- Do you cook a lot? Is food preparation safety important to you and your family?

If you are like most home buyers, choosing the perfect countertop surface for your new living space can be a real challenge. We'd like to help you prioritize the attributes that are most important to you, and match those attributes to the countertop material that best suits your needs.

#### Color... Pattern... Movement

- If color and pattern consistency are important, we recommend:
  - Solid Surface (both kitchen & bath)
  - Natural Quartz Surfacing (both kitchen & bath)
  - **Engineered Marble (bath only)**
- If more variation in the color, pattern, or movement is preferred, we recommend:
   Traditional Granite (both kitchen & bath)
- If significant variation in color, pattern, or movement is preferred, we recommend:
   Exotic Granite (both kitchen & bath)

Note: No two countertop pieces will be alike.

## Countertop Seams... Inconspicuous or Visible?

- For a one-piece appearance with inconspicuous seams, we suggest:
   Solid Surface (both kitchen & bath with integral sink options available)
- ♦ If visible seams are not a design concern, we suggest:

Traditional Granite (both kitchen & bath)

Natural Quartz Surfacing (both kitchen & bath)

Natural Marble (bath only)

**Engineered Marble (bath only)** 

If highly visible seams are not a design concern, we suggest:

Exotic Granite (both kitchen & bath)

Note: Seams will be much more obvious due to joining together of natural stones that have dramatic movement and color patterns.

#### Stain Resistance

- If you desire a surface that is non-porous, and requires no sealing, your solutions include:

   Solid Surface (both kitchen & bath)
   Natural Quartz Surfacing (both kitchen & bath)
   Engineered Marble (bath only)
- Countertops that are porous and require sealing include:
   Traditional Granite (both kitchen & bath)
   Exotic Granite (both kitchen & bath)
   Natural Marble (bath only)

### **Food Preparation Safety**

Non-porous surfaces that do not promote the growth of bacteria include:
 Solid Surface (both kitchen & bath)
 Natural Quartz Surfacing (both kitchen & bath)
